BYU COLLEGE AWARDS

Deadline: Winter 2024 (check with your college advisor)

The BYU Phi Kappa Phi Executive Committee has authorized a College Award program to recognize academic excellence in Phi Kappa Phi members across the University. Each college is given between \$600 and \$1,800 dollars to award to Phi Kappa Phi members in their college.
